## **Statement of intent**

The Federation of Greenmount and Gatten & Lake Primary School's is committed to ensuring equal opportunities for all pupils, regardless of financial circumstances and have created this policy to ensure we adhere to legal requirements regarding charging for federation activities and meet all statutory guidance provided by the DfE.

The federation will ensure that this policy is published on both its individual school websites and provides the federation community with details of activities for which the federation will charge parents, and the circumstances in which they will waive any charge parents would otherwise expect to pay.

## 1. Legal framework

This policy has due regard to all relevant legislation and statutory guidance including, but not limited to, the following:

- Children Act 1989
- DfE (2018) 'Charging for school activities'
- DfE (2024) 'Maintained schools governance guide'
- DfE (2024) 'What maintained schools must or should publish online'
- Education Act 1996
- Freedom of Information Act 2000
- The Charges for Music Tuition (England) Regulations 2007
- The Education (Prescribed Public Examinations) (England) Regulations 2010

This policy operates in conjunction with the following federation policies:

- Complaints Procedures Policy
- Data Protection Policy
- Debt Recovery Policy
- Freedom of Information Policy
- Freedom of Information Publication Scheme

## 2. Definitions

For the purposes of this policy the following definitions will be used:

**Charge:** a fee payable for specifically defined activities.

**Remission:** the cancellation of a charge, partly or wholly, which would normally be payable.

## 3. Roles and responsibilities

The governing board will be responsible for:

- The management of each federation school's delegated finances
- Ensuring the federation acts in accordance with this policy at all times.
- Ensuring money is spent for the educational benefit of pupils attending the federation, and for the benefit of pupils in other schools.
- Recognising its legal requirements regarding charging for federation activities under the Education Act 1996 and meeting all additional guidance provided by the DfE.

The headteacher will be responsible for:

- Prioritising and allocating financial resources appropriately, ensuring efficiency, effectiveness and probity in the use of public funds.
- Informing parents on low incomes and in receipt of specific benefits of the support available to them when being asked for contributions towards the cost of school visits.
- Liaising with parents and staff regarding any charges being applied and making decisions regarding appropriate remissions on a case-by-case basis.

The SBM will:

- Process and record payments for activities, taking into account any remissions applied.
- Ensure that the correct invoices are sent to parents, and that payment is received.

#### **4. Charging for education**

The federation will not charge for:

- Admission applications.
- Education provided during school hours, including the supply of any materials, books, instruments or other equipment.
- Education provided outside school hours if it is part of the national curriculum, part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for by the federation, or part of RE.
- Instrumental or vocal tuition, for pupils learning individually or in groups, unless provided at the request of the pupil's parent.
- Entry for a prescribed public examination, if the pupil has been prepared for it at the federation.
- Examination resits, if the pupil is being prepared for the resits at the federation.

The federation may charge for:

- Materials, books, instruments or equipment, where the child's parent wishes their child to own them.
- Optional extras.
- Music tuition (in limited circumstances).
- Certain early years provision.
- The use of community facilities and other commercial activities.
- Provision of information within the scope of freedom of information.

#### **5. Optional extras**

The federation may charge for the following optional extras:

- Education provided outside of school time that is not:
  - Part of the national curriculum
  - Part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the federation
  - Part of RE
- Examination entry fees where the pupil has not been prepared for the examinations at the federation
- Transport, other than that required to take the pupil to school or to other premises where the LA has arranged for the pupil to be provided with education
- Board and lodging for a pupil on a residential visit
- Extended day services offered to pupils, e.g. breakfast, after school clubs, tea and supervised homework sessions.

When calculating the cost of optional extras, an amount may be included in relation to the following:

- Materials, books, instruments or equipment provided in relation to the optional extra
- The cost of buildings and accommodation
- Non-teaching staff, including TAs
- Teaching staff under contracts for services purely to provide an optional extra
- The cost, or an appropriate proportion of the costs, for teaching staff employed to provide vocal tuition or tuition in playing a musical instrument, where the tuition is an optional extra

The federation will not charge in excess of the actual cost of providing the optional extra divided by the number of participating pupils.

Charges applied will not include an element of subsidy for any pupils wishing to participate but whose parents are unwilling or unable to pay the full charge.

In cases where a small proportion of the activity takes place during school hours, the federation will not charge for the cost of alternative provision for those not participating.

The federation will not charge for supply teachers to cover for teachers who are absent from the federation accompanying pupils on a residential visit.

Participation in any optional activity will be on the basis of parental choice and a willingness to meet the charges; therefore, parental agreement is a prerequisite for the provision of an optional extra where charges will be made.

If a charge is to be made for a particular activity, such as optional extras, parents will be informed of how the charge will be calculated.

## **6. Voluntary contributions**

The federation may, from time-to-time, ask for voluntary contributions towards the benefit of the federation or federation activities. If an activity cannot be funded without voluntary contributions, the federation will make this clear to parents at the outset. The federation will make it clear to parents that there will be no obligation for parents to make any contribution. Parents will be notified regarding whether assistance is available.

No pupil will be excluded from an activity simply because their parents are unwilling or unable to pay. If a parent is unwilling or unable to pay, their child will still be given an equal opportunity to take part in the activity and the federation will set out how places will be allocated from the outset. If insufficient voluntary contributions are raised to fund an activity, and the federation cannot fund it via another source, the activity will be cancelled, and this will be made clear to parents.

## **7. Examination fees and resits**

The federation may charge for examination fees if:

- The examination is on the set list (which includes SATs, GCSEs and A-levels), but the pupil was not prepared for it at the federation.

- The examination is not on the set list, but the federation arranged for the pupil to take it.
- A pupil fails, without good reason, to complete the requirements of any public examination where the governing board or LA originally paid or agreed to pay the entry fee.

Where a pupil is entered for a second or subsequent attempt at an examination, the federation will pay the fee. Once pupils have left the federation, resits must be taken at the federation.

If a pupil or their parent consider it to be in the best interests of the pupil to request that an examination is re-marked, any fees involved will be covered by the pupil or their parent. If the awarding body changes the overall grade of the result, the federation will not be charged by the awarding body and the parent or pupil will have their fees refunded.

## **8. Music tuition**

The federation is aware that instrumental and vocal music tuition is an exception to the rule that all education provided during school hours must be free. The Charges for Music Tuition (England) Regulations 2007 allow for charges to be made for vocal or instrumental tuition provided either individually or to groups of any size – provided that the tuition is at the request of the pupil's parents. In such cases, the charges applied will not exceed the cost of the provision, including the cost of the staff providing the tuition.

There will be no charges applied if the music tuition is an essential part of the national curriculum.

Charges will not be made if the teaching is provided under the first access to the KS2 Instrumental and Vocal Tuition Programme.

## **9. Transport**

The federation will not charge for:

- Transporting registered pupils to or from the federation premises, where the LA has a statutory obligation to provide the transport.
- Transporting registered pupils to other premises where the governing board or LA has arranged for pupils to be educated.
- Transporting pupils to meet an examination requirement when they have been prepared for the examination at the federation.

## **10. Residential visits**

The federation will not charge for:

- Education provided on any visit that takes place during school hours.
- Education provided on any visit that takes place outside school hours if it is part of the national curriculum, part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the federation, or part of RE.
- Supply teachers to cover for teachers accompanying pupils on visits.

The federation may charge for board and lodging, but the charge will not exceed the actual cost.

Parents will be in receipt of support towards costs if Free School Meals / Pupil Premium Funding is received.

## **11. Education partly during school hours**

The federation will follow DfE guidance when determining whether an activity is deemed to take place during school hours or not, as set out below:

- If 50 percent or more of the time spent on an activity occurs during school hours (including time spent travelling if the travel occurs during school hours), it will be deemed to take place during school hours and no charge will be made.
- If less than 50 percent of the time spent on an activity occurs during school hours, it will be deemed to have taken place outside school hours and the school may charge for the activity; however, the federation will not charge if the activity is part of the national curriculum, part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the federation, or part of RE.
- Whatever the start and finish times of the school day, regulations require that the school day is divided into two sessions. School hours will not include the break in the middle of the day.

The remission of charges for board and lodging payments is the responsibility of the federation. These costs will be borne by the federation.

Any charges for extended day services will be optional.

If the number of school sessions covered by the visit is equal to or greater than 50 percent of the number of half days (any period of 12 hours ending with noon or midnight on any day) spent on the visit, it will be deemed to have taken place during school hours and the federation will not charge for the activity.

## **12. Damaged or lost items**

The federation may charge for the cost of replacing items that are damaged or lost due to the negligence or poor behaviour of pupils or their parents. Parents will only be charged the replacement cost to purchase the same or equivalent item.

The federation will consider waiving costs in exceptional circumstances.

## **13. Remissions**

The federation will set aside a fund to enable parents in financial difficulty to send their children on visits and activities. The funding will be limited and there is no guarantee that all requests can be met. Assistance will be allocated on a needs basis, and if the full cost of the trip or activity cannot be met through assistance funding and voluntary contributions, the trip or activity will be cancelled.

Parents in receipt of any of the following benefits will receive support of 50% costs for the benefit of the activity:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided that they are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and they have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run on – paid for four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
- Universal Credit – if they apply on or after 1 April 2018, their household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits they receive)

## **14. Federation trip refunds**

All initial deposits for federation trips will be non-refundable. Parents will be informed of this when they are provided with initial information about the trip.

In the event that the federation has to cancel a trip due to foreseen circumstances, parental contributions will be refunded. In the event that a federation trip is cancelled by a party other than the federation due to unforeseen circumstances, it is at the federation's discretion as to whether a refund is given to parents.

In the event that a pupil or their parents cancel the pupil's place on a trip, it will be at the federation's discretion as to whether a refund is given. The federation will take into account the reason for cancellation, whether the federation will be reimbursed for the pupil's place on the trip, and whether the place on the trip can be offered to another pupil.

Where a pupil or their parents have previously cancelled a place on a trip and received a full refund, the federation will have the right to refuse to allow the pupil to attend future trips and visits.

In the event that a pupil cannot attend a trip at the last minute, e.g. due to illness, it will be at the federation's discretion as to whether a refund is given. The federation will take into account whether the federation will be reimbursed for the pupil's place on the trip and whether the place on the trip can be offered to another pupil.

In the event that a federation trip is postponed due to unforeseen circumstances, it will be at the federation's discretion as to what happens with the parental contributions for the trip. The federation will consider its options, which could include carrying forward the money until the trip takes place, transferring the money to another trip, or refunding parents.

In the event that the decision is made to postpone a trip due to foreseen circumstances, it will be at the federation's discretion as to what happens with the parental contributions for the trip. The federation will consider its options, which could include carrying forward the money until the trip takes place, transferring the money to another trip, or refunding parents.

Once trip arrangements have been booked and confirmed, if contributions exceed the total cost of the trip, a refund will be given where the excess is greater than £1 per pupil.

The federation will deal with cancellations and refunds on a case-by-case basis, ensuring that all pupils and their families are treated equally.

If a parent wishes to make a complaint about refunds, they will be able to do so via the Complaints Procedures Policy.

## **15. Freedom of Information Policy and Publication Scheme**

The federation's Freedom of Information Policy and Freedom of Information Publication Scheme will set out where fees may be charged for the provision of information.

## **16. Monitoring and review**

This policy will be reviewed at least annually by the governing board. The next scheduled review date for this policy is June 2026.
